In What Shape is Your Church?

One aspect of the Church is the way churches (the facilities of the Church) have been and continue to be constructed. Often, older churches were built in the form of a cross. Today, this design isn't as common for new churches. Many new facilities are created simply to be functional and less expensive. Prairie Peace was and is this way. If a family enters a larger, recently constructed church, it will probably be more "pie-shaped" in order to accommodate more people, its altar and lecturn/pulpit being placed at the apex of this form. There are even "circle" churches being erected. The altar is in the middle. This continually reminds worshipers that our loving, atoning God dwells in the midst of His community, whose members are united by Him to each other "within the circle" and are to love, care for and serve one another

After all, isn't this to be one of the primary activities of our Lord Jesus' people while they are here on this planet? To sacrificially love, care for and serve one another? This is why Prairie Peace, Valier and

Faith Lutheran Churches were initially, so carefully created by our Living God. He always pinpoint- focuses our hearts, then and now, on the redeeming cross and vacated, promise-validating tomb of Jesus, His One and Only Son. God's Word shouts and reverberatingly echos throughout its pages this sacrificial care and "action-love" of the Creator of everything.

whom Paul deeply loved, had a disagreement (or, disagreements), dividing the membership.

St. Paul spoke so, so gently to his beloved church's condition. He never even directly mentioned this heart-rending issue until the very end of the letter. Yet, the entire letter urged each member toward

Christian unity, which was to have its sole origin in the visualization of Jesus' overwhelming humility. How Jesus humbled Himself so totally that He willingly died for us, even death on a cross, Paul wrote,

to bring each of us to Himself forever!

This is the sacrificial love we're to have toward and with each other. Our Savior is the image of humility we're to adopt and live toward and with each other. Past grievances and actions—and in some cases, only notions—must be forgiven, even though they cannot be forgotten! They must never be heldbagainst one another! At all humbling costs, each one of us is to treasure the God-given gitts of all

the God-given gifts of all who've been called and brought into the same God-generated household-of-faith through God's true gift of faith in the only true humble Savior ever born. (And, if there are those prone not to forgive, they hadbetter read Matthew 6:148amp;15!)

PLEASE READ THIS NEXT SENTENCE CAREFULLY! God has called each of us into His Kingdom in order to be at Prairie Peace, Valier and Faith at this very moment in order to appreciate, respect, cherish and care for one another so His everlasting Kingdom at each location is stabilized by God the Holy Spirit working in and energizing our hearts through His Word so Matthew 28:18-20, the growth of His everlasting Kingdom, is fully realized. There are no ifs, ands or buts about this! Let's each one of us fervently pray that the Holy Trinity forms our hearts toward loving each other and working with everything we are and have to fulfill His eternal goals for us and all whom He's chosen. And, keeps us in this "shape"!
